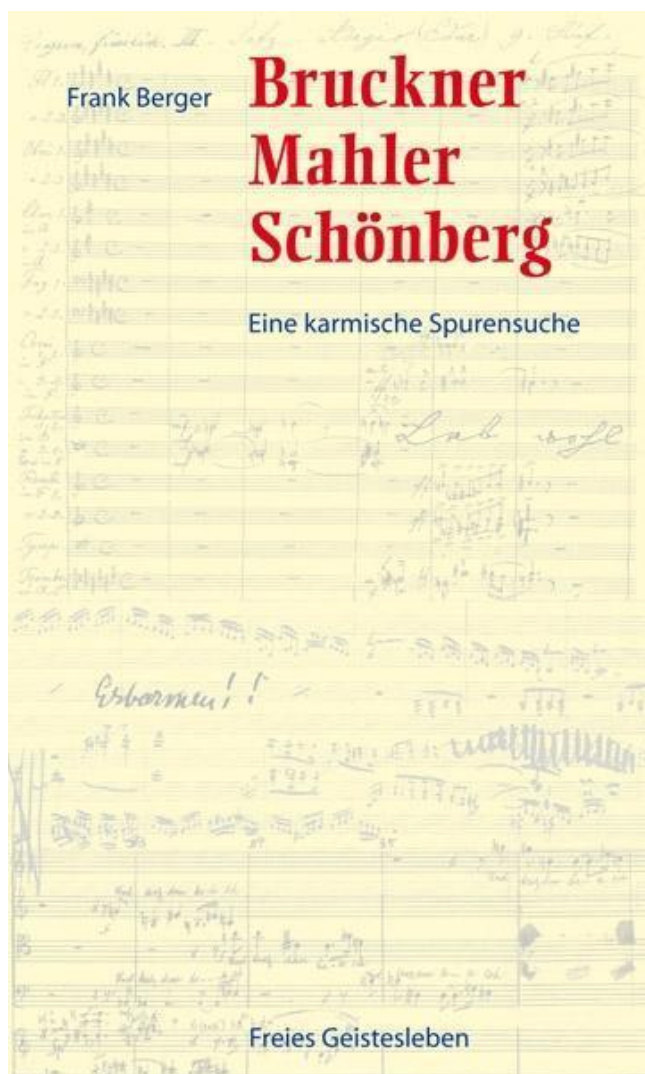

Dr. Feisst called Dr. Newlin “one of the pioneers of Schoenberg research in America.” Dr. Newlin's doctoral dissertation was published as the book “Bruckner, Mahler, Schoenberg” (1947, 1968). She also translated Schoenberg's works from German to English, and her publication of diaries she kept as his student provide.

The two Schoenberg works on this program, *Waldesnacht* and *Verklärte Nacht* give an insight into what was happening with smaller forces. While some composers from this period composed almost exclusively for large forces (Bruckner and Mahler spring to mind) there was still plenty of imagination for chamber music.

Mahler studied at the Vienna Conservatoire with Robert Fuchs (*1847, 1927), among others, and privately with Anton Bruckner. . Not only do they refer back to tradition, they also strongly influenced harmonic and melodic means of New Music (especially Arnold Schoenberg, Alban Berg and Anton Webern). Works:
